

Introducing...

Dr. Harold D. Atkins

AEA President

At 8 years of age young Harold Atkins had only ten percent vision in his right eye and was going blind in his left. He was informed that his eyes would become severely crossed and that he would eventually lose his sight. He suffered the humiliation of not being able to keep up in the classroom with his peers as he struggled with his eye condition.

At the age of 12, Harold responded to the gospel and began his Christian walk. He was able to enter seminary because of an arrangement that the school would provide five readers to assist him in his learning struggles from being partially sighted. During classes he became impacted by Hebrews 12:8, "...Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever." The Lord impressed Harold that he did not have to be blind and his faith began to expand. Harold focused on a clear vision of the Lord and His nail scarred hands and claimed His healing touch. Harold's eyes were healed and the Lord gave him a new mission to reach the lost and the sick.



Dr. Atkins was introduced to AEA founder and President, Dr. John E. Douglas in 1957.

Three months after marrying Betty, Harold entered full time ministry holding meetings in churches, auditoriums and crusade tents all across the nation. In 1968 the Lord fulfilled the vision of the ministry when he was called to have meetings around the world.

New churches and children's homes resulted that were operated by native directors and pastors trained to serve.

Dr. Atkins was introduced to AEA founder and President, Dr. John E. Douglas in 1957. As Dr. Atkins saw how the Lord was using AEA, he began what was to become a 45-year affiliation.

Dr. Atkins became a part of Dr. Douglas's "inner circle" of wise counselors and worked with the President to meet the many challenges of the association.

Dr. Atkins brings years of "on the firing line" experience to AEA leadership. Having been the Lord's man operating in faith and trust for all provisions, has given him a spiritual perspective that will benefit AEA leaders/members in fulfilling each of their God-given missions.

God's Man on God's Mission

Dr. John E. Douglas was a man who cared. Ask hundreds of the pastors ordained over the years by the AEA if Johnny cared. Ask the directors of the division of the AEA if Dr. John cared.

First, he cared about the Lord's work. He wanted to be the Lord's man...to be directed and guided by the Lord he loved so much. Second, he cared about those in the AEA ministering to others. He went the extra mile to back the men and women "called." He, of course, cared for his loved ones.

John Douglas founded and led the AEA as a visionary. While leading AEA he started and directed a successful Bible College in Baltimore. He founded World Missionary Evangelism that grew to an annual budget of \$30,000,000 airing Christian radio programs heard globally with orphanages caring for more than 100,000 youngsters. He served in leadership on the board of another division of AEA, Christian Care MediShare, which currently serves more than 40,000 members in all fifty States and sixty-five foreign nations.



Dr. Douglas has preached to stadiums of seekers during his special meetings in the greater Baltimore area. He was a friend to and a friend of this nation's leading evangelists. Men of national prominence sought the benefits of his wisdom and guidance. With his influence and strategies he had state laws changed and made. Senators, congressmen, governors and mayors maneuvered to curry his favor.

His first love was the pastors he shepherded in the AEA. Hundreds of issues concerning church disputes were settled because he was there for the pastor. Every AEA pastor knew they had a listening ear with their leader. He revived the pastors who were "burned out." He lifted the downtrodden and he forgave and restored the fallen. All his life Dr. John has been the rare combination of a visionary, evangelist, leader, and friend. When he knew he was right, nobody had more focus than John Douglas and all those who were out of accord stepped aside. When people said it couldn't be done, Dr. John encouraged them to move forward. When the many said there was no money, Dr. John knew the Lord was waiting to provide it. When the gloom and doomers talked about giving up, Dr. John ran up the flag to attack. The AEA and all whose lives Dr. John has touched will miss him.

Dr. Marjorie, his loving caregiver, dedicated wife and friend, will continue serving in leadership on the board of AEA. Dr. Marjorie has been active in the administrative details and board decisions over the years.

Refuge of Hope

Disciple Center

Refuge of Hope Disciple Center is a faith-based community outreach center ministering to the needs of the urban community and providing humanitarian relief via its social, educational, spiritual, and recreational programs to youth, adults, and senior citizens of the D.C. metropolitan area and abroad.

Refuge of Hope was founded in 1990 by Doctors Charles and Judy Farmer, Pastors and Center Directors, with a dedication to the plight of the disadvantaged. As native Washingtonians, their vision is to make a difference in their city by making a positive difference in the lives of the people.

Refuge of Hope distributes emergency food, clothing, and educational supplies to anyone in need. It operates community outreach centers for youth and adults providing career education, crisis intervention counseling, community field trips, drug prevention programs, summer youth camps, and the BEDT Instruments of Praise School for the Performing Arts.

In addition, Refuge of Hope has also provided educational training and humanitarian relief via humanitarian trips to Ghana, Togo, Benin in West Africa and Guyana, South America where the pastors have worked alongside the local people in improving their living environments through emergency relief.

The U.S. Department of Justice, the U.S. Attorney's Office, the U.S. Marshal Service, and the D.C. Metropolitan Police Department as part of its "Operation Goodwill Program," donated five row houses which were formerly used as drug dealing crack houses by the infamous "P. Street Crew." Following the arrest and conviction of the gang leaders, the building sat vacant and unoccupied, a sore reminder to the community of the drugs, violence and degradation that occurred there.

In a successful joint venture with the D.C. Jewish Community Center's Behrend Builders Program and its

Project Director, Richard Feldman, Refuge of Hope along with hundreds of volunteers is in the process of remodeling these properties to become the new Refuge of Hope Community Outreach Center for the North Capitol community. This joint venture along with many other organizations is a perfect example of how faith-based organizations can enhance programs in the community in which it serves.

The new center will feature:

- Crisis intervention counseling for youth and their families
- Emergency temporary housing for displaced families
- Child development and recreation center for youth
- Prevention through the Arts
- Classrooms for the adult career education program
- Food pantry and clothing bank

The intimacy of small group worship in times of national insecurity

As a result of the September 11 terrorists attacks on our country everyone appears to be in some state of insecurity, fear, and panic. The majority of people are asking the question: "Why did God allow this to happen?" I believe we should concentrate on keeping our eyes on Jesus. In these times of insecurity we can remain in spiritual peace. We need to remove ourselves from the fear and the panic. This is a time for the Body of Christ to come together, exhorting one another (Heb. 3:12-14). This can be done with small Group worship.

I strongly believe that small group worship helps to become more intimate with God while becoming intimate as Christians. We are the body of Christ. In doing so we learn to edify one another. This the Lord called us to do. Because we believe in Jesus' greatness, we want to include others. He is the center of life and we are His case studies of what He does. During the closeness of worship, the people who care about each other will reach out to give help. They tend to be the people who cope best with the pressures and anxieties of life. People helping and the bearing of one another's burdens may be one of the best ways to control and prevent anxiety and insecurity.

As a Biblical Counselor, I have found that anxiety is a basic part of all psychological problems. It warns worshipers of danger and motivates them to take action. When it creates panic or immobilizes individuals, the anxiety is harmful. When it challenges us to deal more effectively with the challenges of life, it can be helpful.

God knows about our needs and helps us to cope by admitting fears, insecurities, conflicts and anxieties when they arise. During small group – intimate worship – we collectively should strive to give Him first priority in our lives, knowing that our needs will be supplied, and eventually there would be no need to be anxious nor feel insecure.

Small group worship helps others to stay grounded and steady in that bond of trust. To be constantly in tuned to our Lord, but careful not to be distracted or diverted. Because we are small, group worship can easily become woven into a tapestry of love, in touch with everything there is to know of God. We can help each other to develop our minds with confidence, focused on Christ. All have received Jesus Christ, the Master. Now it is time for all to live in Him. All are deeply rooted in Him. We know our way around the faith, what we need is to do what we have been taught. With His peace, we can become in tune with each other, in step with each other. We can cultivate thankfulness – allowing the Word of Christ – the Message – to have the run of our group.

Instructing and directing one another utilizing good common sense. Getting every detail of our lives – words, actions, whatever – be done in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, while thanking God the Father every step of the way. As we quietly work together to grow in maturity, we become well developed, while minimizing deficiencies that may arise.
