President's Letter

SHOULD CHRISTIANS VOTE FOR A MORMON?

The big day is coming up soon. One of two candidates will be our President for four years. I've been asked whether I have any hesitation voting for a Mormon. Ideally, I would like to vote for a person who represented my values and was a true Christian. We don't always have that opportunity. My answer is, that a candidate who advocates the kinds of values that furthers the freedom of worship and our other freedoms guaranteed by our founding documents while also advocating Biblical morality, is worthy of my serious consideration. Paying attention to a candidate's track record is where we need to focus. Going down a platform list should demand several questions, like; does this exemplify the Christian walk? Does this impair, modify or redefine a clear biblical teaching? Is any candidate offering an alternative?

In short, I will not vote for or against a candidate because he or she is a Mormon. I will vote against a candidate if he or she threatens biblically based traditional Christian convictions.

Another question one could ask is whether or not a candidate's religious views encourage them to be good responsible neighbors and good Americans. My hero, General Douglas MacArthur put it succinctly, Duty, Honor, Country.

Neither candidate is my perfect choice but we rarely have that luxury. One thing is for sure I'd crawl through 100 yards of glass to vote this year. Keep the election in your prayers and financially support as much as you can afford, the candidate of your choice.

THE GREAT COMMISSION - BE FISHERS OF MEN

A Report From Rev. David Lee, President of Christian Vision For China (CVC)

June 2012

"Ever since the day I was called to serve the Lord forty years ago, I have acknowledged God's way is the best way. Nobody knows the roads ahead of him and neither can he comprehend the entire plan of God. Therefore to obey the leading of the Lord is not only a must, it's the best choice of all."

Rev. David Lee bid farewell to the church he had shepherded for 16 years on May 15 of last year. Within this past year, his older son got married. He also put his house on the market and within a short time, the Lord provided a buyer. "Trust and Obey By the Lord's hand, he raised enough funds for the first year of ministry and is on schedule to set forth for the new journey ahead, departing at the end of June. Rev. Lee's focus is on two ministries that are often neglected:

- 1. Search and visit pastors who served the Lord faithfully but were put into labor camps during the Cultural Revolution. He wants to bring to them the love and respect from their fellow Christians, and to assure them that they live with dignity before the Lord calls them home.
- 2. Support indigenous young pastors financially so that they can serve the Lord without worrying about their daily living. Assist them to acquire medical training so that they can support themselves, as well as supporting his or her fellow coworkers, just like the Apostle Paul did.

Rev. Lee has been doing these two tasks that God bestowed on him ever since 2002. He asked the Lord to give him another ten years, so that he can devote himself in the ministry wholeheartedly and to motivate others to participate. This is Rev. Lee's earnest prayer!



After leaving Chicago on June 30, Rev. Lee spent two weeks in Taiwan visiting relatives and friends, then headed to Dali to make it their new hometown. They spent two weeks cleaning, fixing and purchasing the basic essentials for their rental housing in the village. Everything is now in place for normal functions, except for the lack of private transportation.

CVC Board Members Lay Hands

On the first day of the lunar month, they were invited to an activity hosted by a Buddhist temple. This temple used to be a resting haven for ancient travelers. It still attracts lots of worshipers - there he saw lots of people who need to be reached!

The first Sunday they attended the worship service at the church in Dali Ancient City, and met an elderly Canadian whose grandfather and father were both missionaries to China. He was born in Dali but was forced to get out of the country in 1948. This was the first time he had returned to his birth place since his departure. He was accompanied by Elder Wu, an acquaintance of his father, to revisit his birth place. He shared lots of his childhood memories.

The neighbor from the States came and visited them during the first few days after Rev. Lee arrived. It

was joyful to see old friends in the new land. They also had internet service installed in a week. They are very thankful for this service, because they feel like they are still living on the other side of the Pacific.

> Accompanied by local coworkers, they attended a Bai tribal wedding in Weishan, another ancient city from the Tang Dynasty where the Bai tribal culture originated. It is also the hometown for Luo Mei, a student whom CVC has regularly supported. After contacting her, Rev. Lee realized that she had already arranged for him to speak to her fellow villagers after the wedding. Arriving at the wedding late due to a heavy downpour, he thought the people would have gone, but to his surprise they had all waited. Rev. Lee shared a message from Philippians 4:10-20.

Little did he know that Luo Mei had shared a message based on Philippians 4:1-9 just a week before They praised God for prompting them by His Spirit because they did not plan this ahead of time!



Sharing in Weishun

Rev. Lee had heard about the "Flowing Banquets" for a wedding but only experienced it for the first time in Weishan. A "Flowing Banquet" is a feast that serves on a "First come, first served" basis and also "First eat, first depart" basis. He

mentioned, the interesting thing is that people are standing behind your chair even as you are still waiting for your food to be served. A memorable experience for him!

There were three local pastors who took the initiative to visit the land CVC acquired for the Dali Good Health Center. They know Dali is among the most ideal places to build a college for missions. In the past, Dali had been a missionary sending point for China Inland Mission. Churches in Kunming also originated by a pioneer missionary sent from Dali. The Bible Training Center in Dali is also seeking to expand their facility. That was the main reason for the local pastors visit. A few days later Rev. Lee met some co-workers who came to the Bible Training Center to advance their studies during the summer break. Rev. Lee prays this beautiful land on the hills of Cang Mountain, acquired by CVC, can be used to serve pastors and Christians as a place to advance their training and a place to find their spiritual tranquility.

They are still adapting to the new environment, but consider themselves settled. Please keep your missionary brothers and sisters in prayer and that all their needs will be met.

XXXXXXX was detained in (that country in the Middle-East persecuting Christians) for his faith in Jesus. We have been praying for his release, but on XX of XXXXXXX the house where XXXXXX was staying was raided by the revolutionary guards and he was taken. We had no news about where he had been taken until recently when we found out that he was in XXXX Prison, a maximum security facility in XXXXX. He is in solitary confinement as a political prisoner charged with plans to overthrow the "that" government by XXXXXXXX XXXXX XXXXX XXXXX movement in "that Middle-East" country.

Recently, I have been reminded of the story of Lazarus when Jesus waited two more days before responding to the sisters' plea to help their brother. I am taken by verses 5 and 6 because Jesus waited for the situation to turn from bad to worse. I can relate to the sisters, but I can also clearly see what the Lord is doing. The situation had to get so impossible that His name would be glorified. Then many of the Jews who had come to Mary, and had seen the things Jesus did, believed in Him." Luke 11:45.
